# 1. Finance report – Scott Kiser CURRENT BALANCE: \$3,163

#### 3. Garden Notes - Rick Thompson

- Water at both gardens turned on but don't yet have enough water going into all beds at Briar patch so Rick has been watering some beds by hand

- Plants are all growing really well now that the temperatures are staying above 60 degrees
- Garlic will come out in June
- There will be a tomato tying and pruning tutorial soon (likely in a few weekends)
- Succession planting is in process
- Snap peas getting ready to bloom
- Working on getting herb garden markers
- Fertilized lightly last week
- Weed me bricks are being placed at end of rows that need weeding to help members identify where to weed.
- Know your row for weeding will begin in early June
